PRINTMAKING Level 1, 2 & Advanced

<u>What is PRINT MAKING?</u> The transference of ink from a less absorbent surface to a more absorbent surface. Often a plate is made out of a variety of different materials so that the image can be reproduced.

Examples of Materials & Processes:

Stamping	Pressing the surface into an ink pad and transferring it to paper. i.e. thumbprint, rubber or foam stamp	Relief Printing	Carving or gouging into the surface of wood or linoleum then rolling ink onto the surface of the plate (the white marks are where material has been carved away)
Frottage	rubbing with crayon, or making a rubbing off an inked surface	Etching	Using acid to bite into a metal plate, the ink is rubbed into the groove and the surface is wiped clean
Collograph	a collection of various textures tape, glue, string, cardboard stuck to a surface and rolled or wiped with ink	Photocopy Transfers	Taking a mechanically produced image (laser, inkjet or magazine) and releasing the ink onto another surface using gel medium, tea-tree oil, gesso, or contact paper
Dry Point	Scratching into the surface of a metal or plastic plate then rubbing ink into the grooves and wiping the surface clean	Silk Screen	A design created using open and closed shapes, like a stencil that is applied to a screen and ink is pushed through the open areas

<u>Course Description & Format:*</u> This course follows the State and National Standards for Visual Arts and meets the A-F requirement for the UC system.

- Opportunity for students of <u>all levels</u> intending to learn to improve the techniques of traditional printmaking and experimental processes. Students will work both independently and collaboratively
- Produce a body of work utilizing the formal elements of art and the fundamental principals of design. The lessons have a specific structure and result in a progressive development.
- Critical thinking and problem-solving skills + integrating your own unique ideas into projects
- Homework/Sketchbook assignments are designed for drawing practice, and project development + collection of visual research: reference images, inspiration from the natural environment and/or contemporary culture.
- **Final projects must always demonstrate the students' original ideas and means of creative expression as well as be appropriate for school (even in art, plagiarism is a serious offense). *See Artistic Integrity Contract

Class Expectations & Guidelines:

Responsibility for materials, safety & proper clean up

- Openness and positive/respectful interactions
- Don't waste time and don't waste materials.

(10 points) CRITERIA- resolution of assigned problem and completing the process work

(10 points) CRAFTSMANSHIP Intentionality of the craft & Neatness

(10 points) EFFORT & INVOLVEMENT- participation, being on task, collaboration- working with others (10 points) CREATIVITY & ORIGINALITY- inventiveness, willingness to go it beyond the basics, unique expression of your own ideas

Homework, project design and development, handouts, research and written assignments, and sketchbook assignments

10% Tests/quizzes, participation in discussion, written reflections, and peer responses

10% Participation: attendance, punctuality, citizenship, clean up, effective use of class time and safety procedures

Extra Credit assignments may be given depending on available materials and the need for refining skills in a certain area. Extra credit cannot be substituted for missed class assignments and will not exceed 5% of the total grade. All extra credit assignments must be **discussed and approved** by the instructor before being done.
